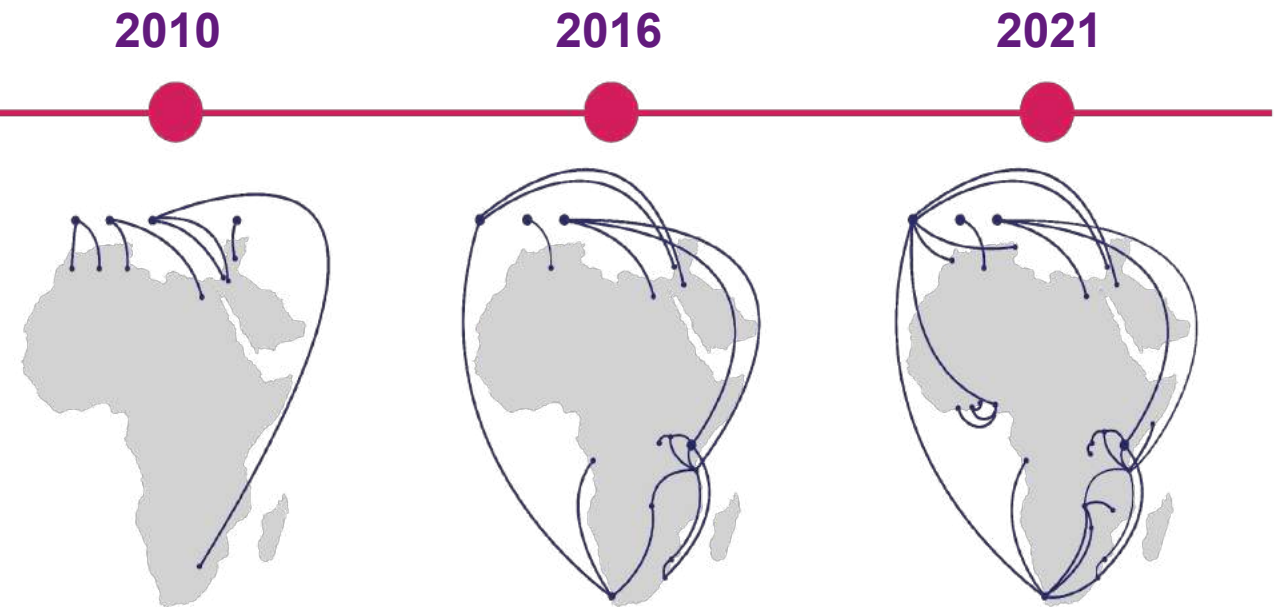

A Pan-African Network in the Making



- Since AfricaConnect **started in 2011**, **22 out of 38 African NRENs** are connected to their regional network:
- **UbuntuNet Alliance:** Burundi, DRC, Kenya, Malawi, Mozambique, Rwanda, Somalia, South Africa, Tanzania, Uganda, Zambia and Zimbabwe.
- **WACREN:** Benin, Burkina Faso and Côte d'Ivoire, Ghana, Nigeria and Togo.
- **ASREN:** Algeria, Egypt, Morocco and Tunisia.
- All three regional networks are growing.
- Next countries to be connected: Mali and Ethiopia.



AC3 Objectives and Outputs



- Enhance human capital development in Africa.
- Unlock the potential of education and research through increased access of African education and research institutions to digital infrastructures and technologies.

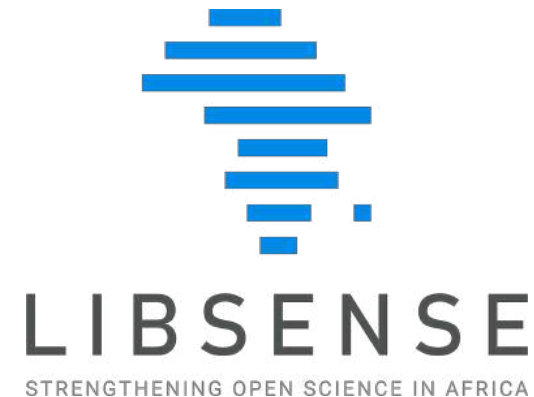

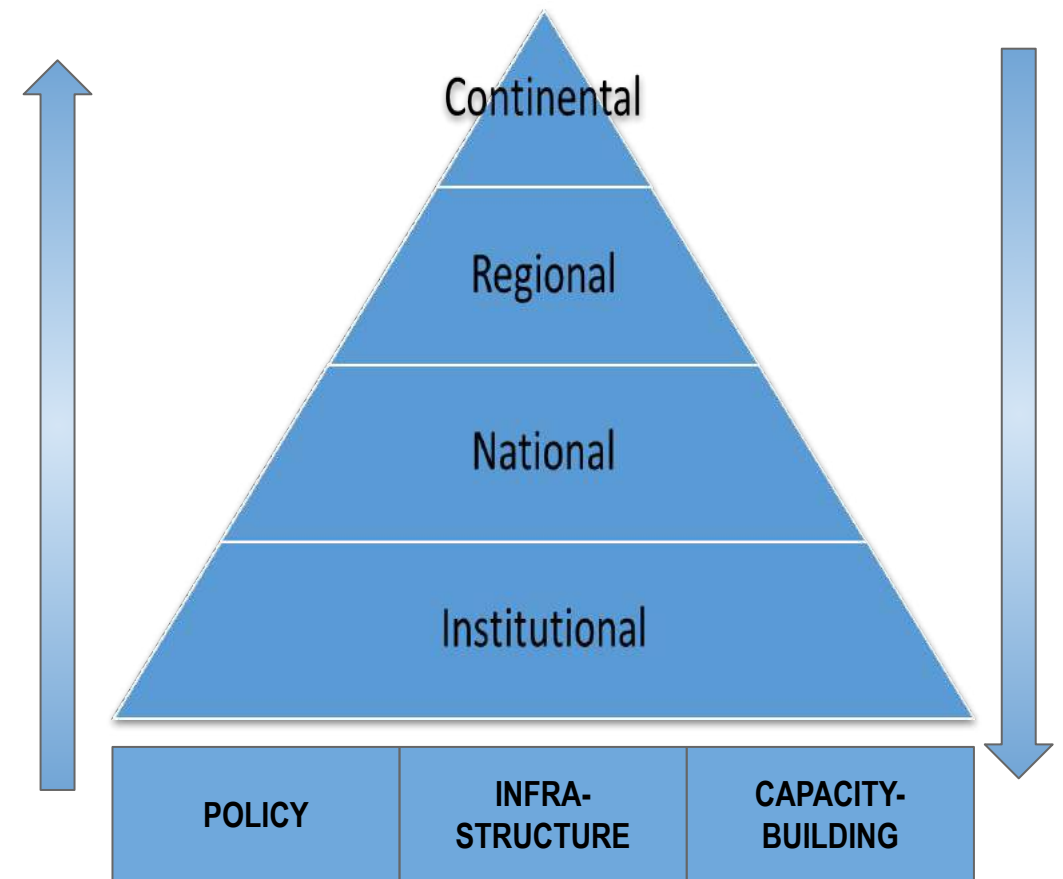
LIBSENSE – Strategy & Organisation

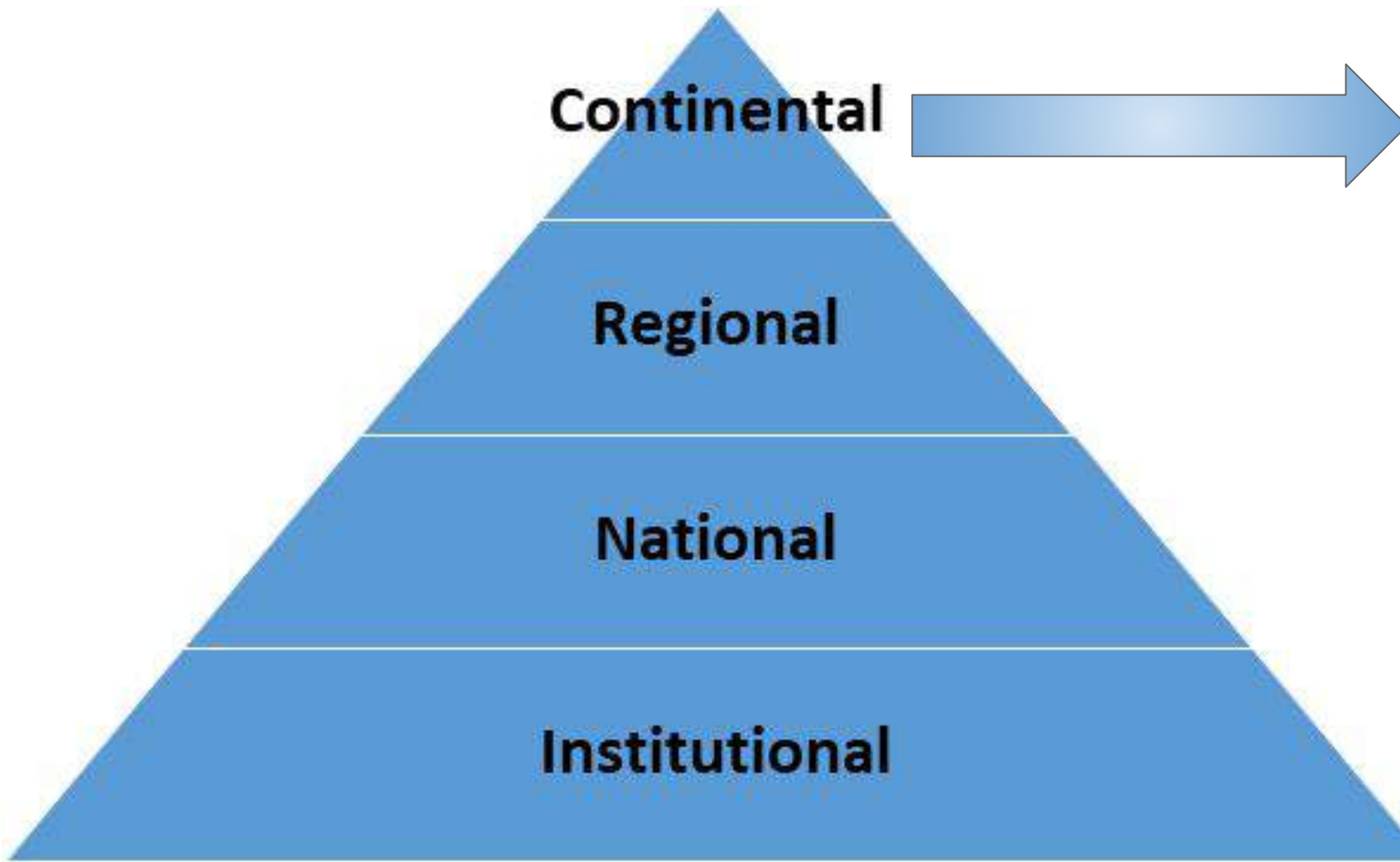
Overall Strategy:

- Building communities of practice
- Strengthening local and national services
- Bottom-up, distributed, heterogeneous
- Inclusive -
 - 3 Working languages, Arabic, English and French
 - Indigenous and traditional knowledge

Three Pillars:

- **Policy:** open science policies, governance and leadership
- **Infrastructure:** open access journals, repositories for publications and data and open discovery services
- **Capacity-building:** communities of practice and training



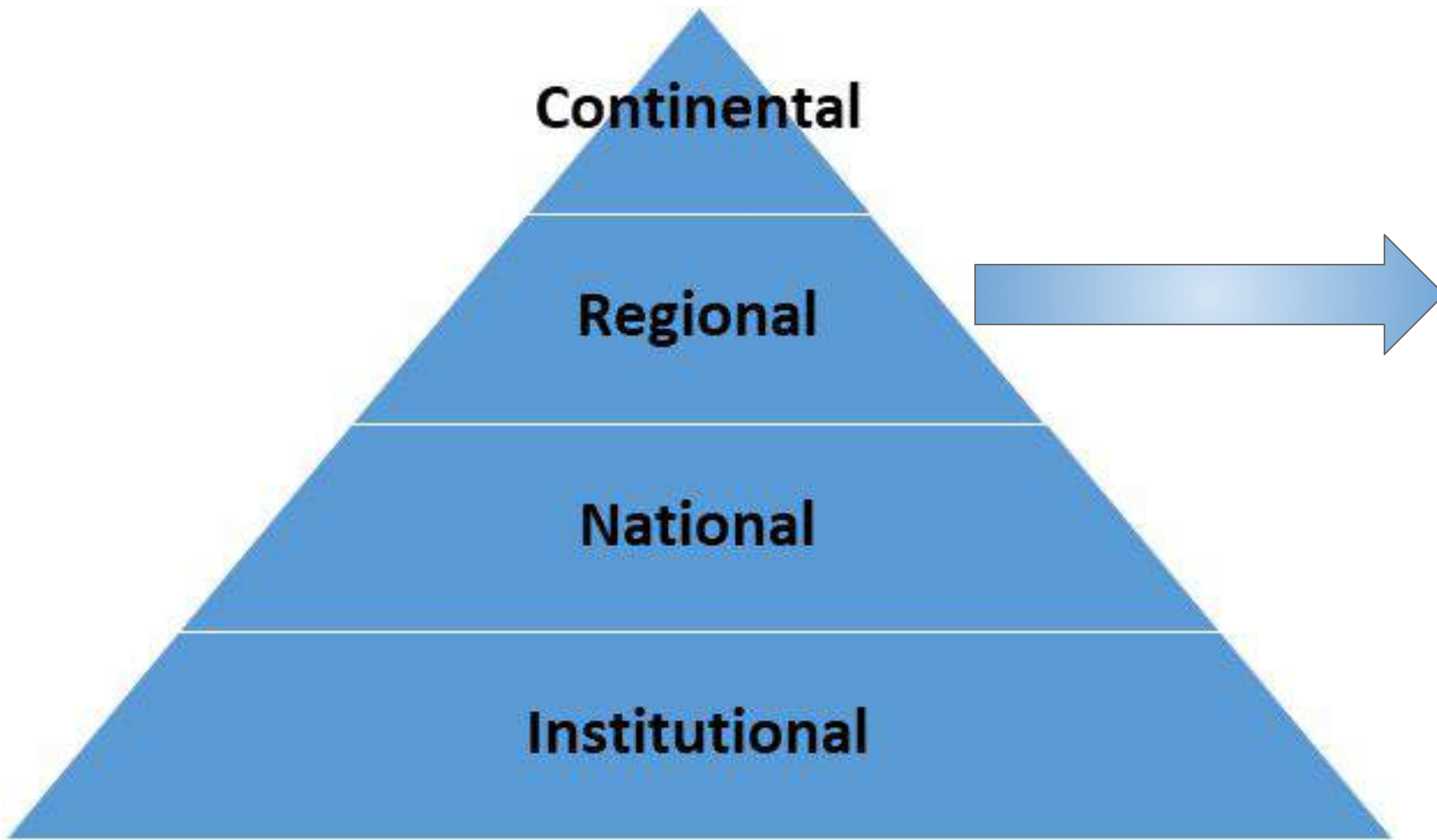


POLICY - Roll-out of Open Science roadmaps across the continent, ensuring African priorities are maintained

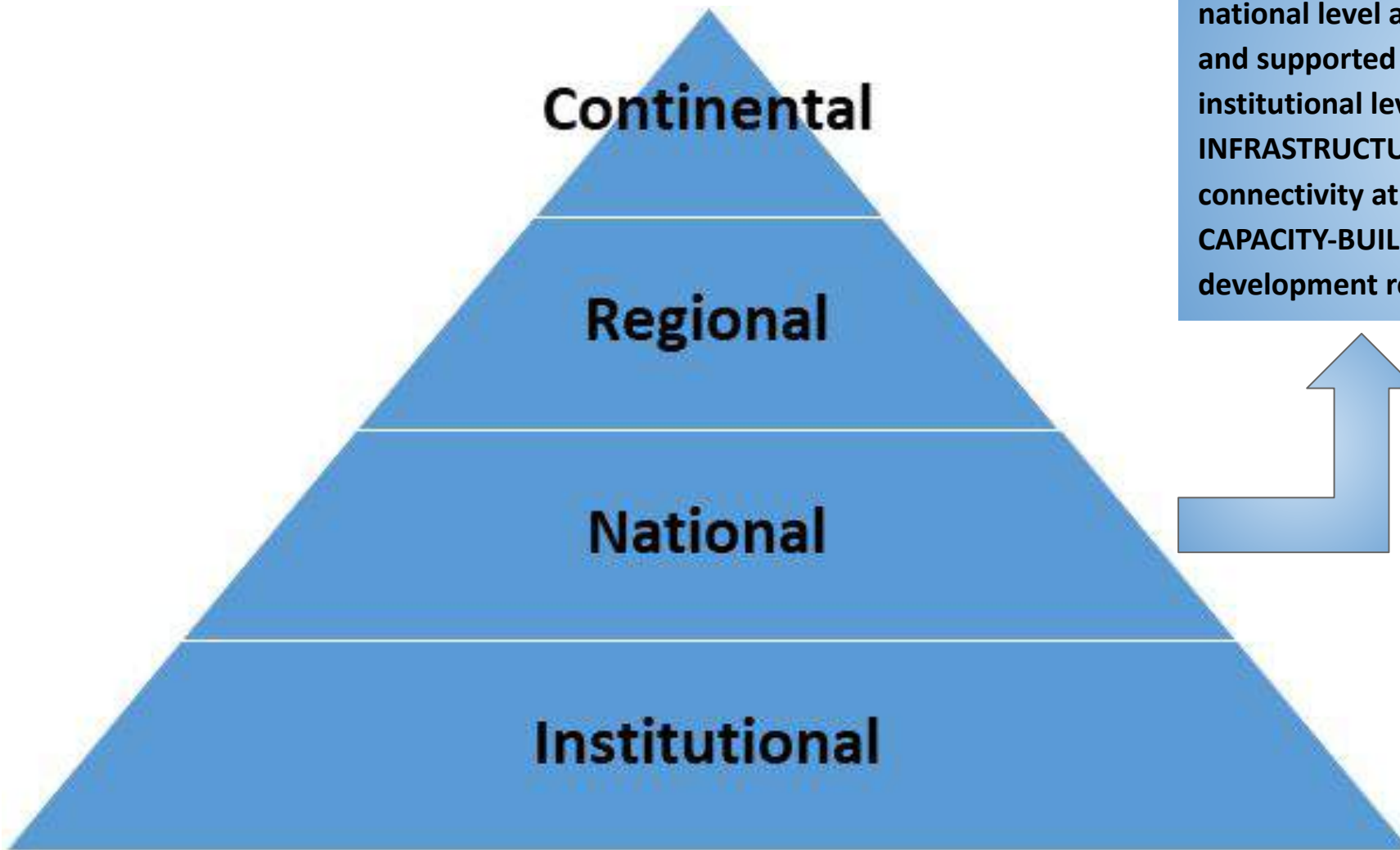


POLICY - Aligning Open Science policy at the regional level leveraging regional HE associations
INFRASTRUCTURE - RRENs aggregating knowledge on what works best and disseminating best practices, monitoring uptake of services and capacities at the regional level
CAPACITY-BUILDING - regional workshops, knowledge building and sharing

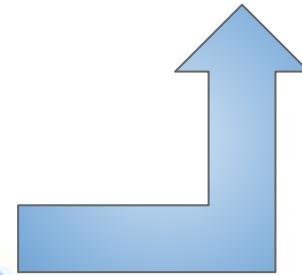
Key Activities/Collaborations:

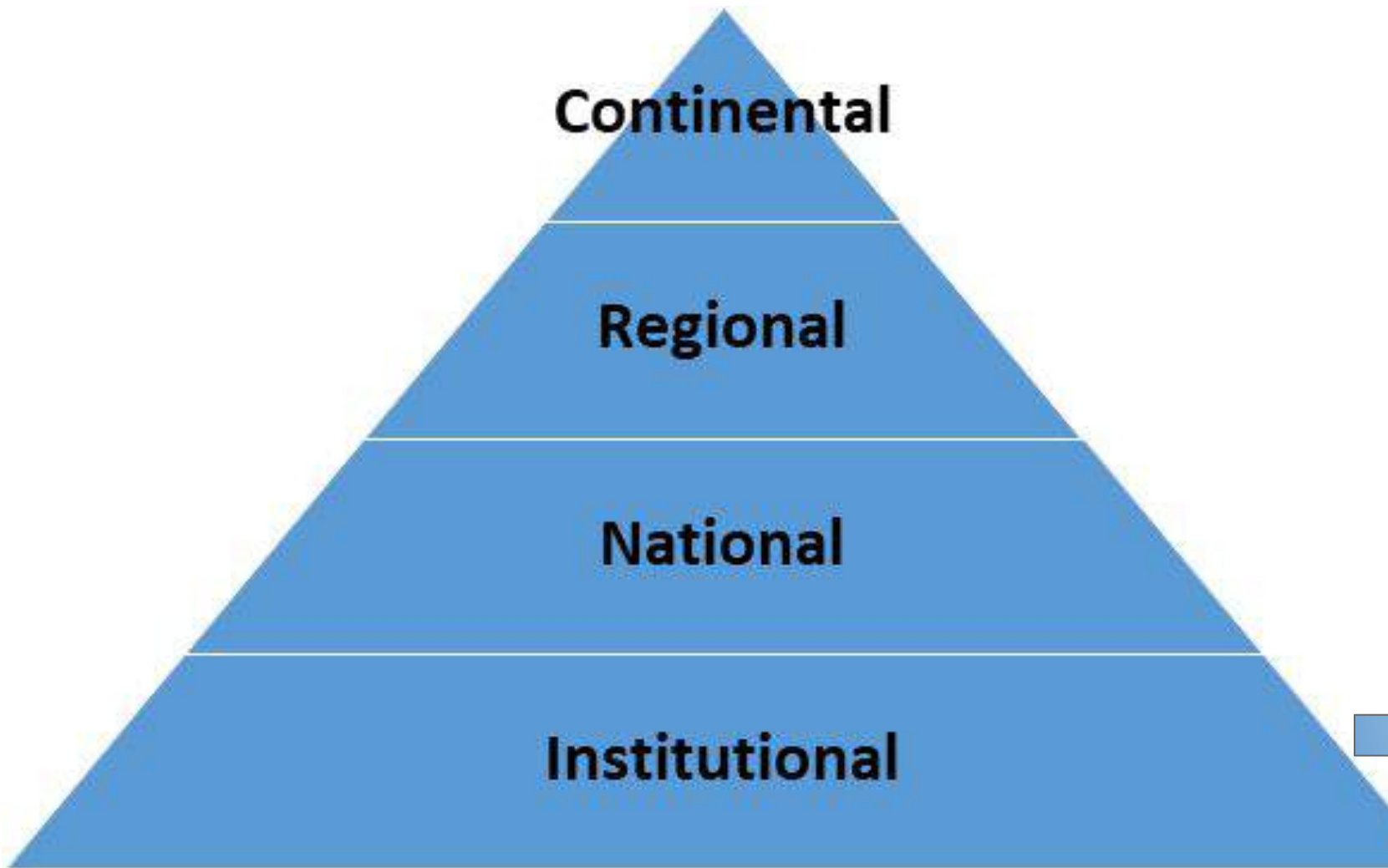
POLICY - Open Science policy development at the national level aligned across Africa and globally and supported by community efforts at the institutional level

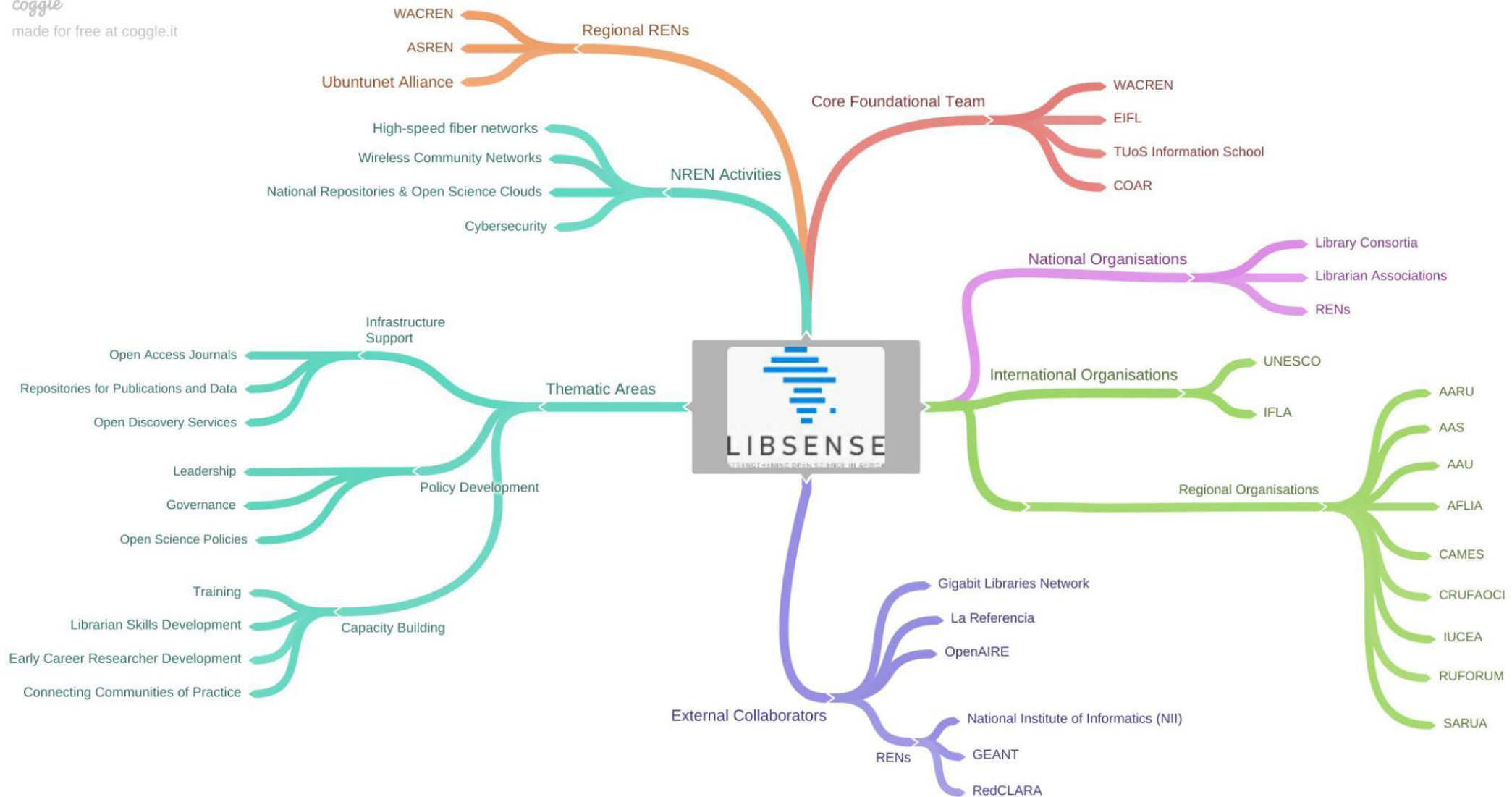

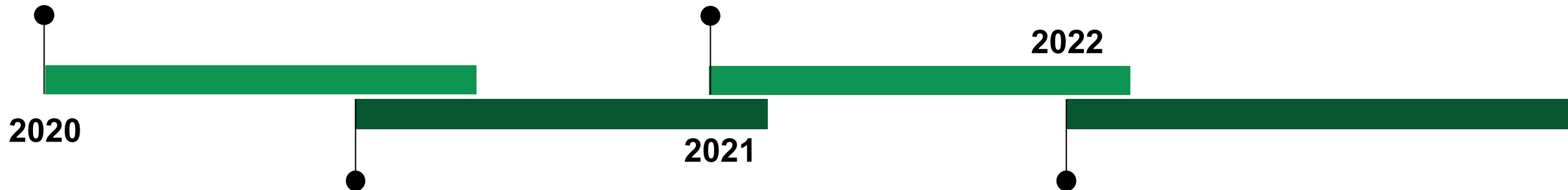

- Focus on policy implementation - moving from high-level goals to role of institutions in implementing open science



Fostering Institutional OS Culture



- Research and university communities engagement
 - Early Career Researcher (ECR) training program
 - Practical guidance and training to help researchers learn how to open up their research processes and results
 - Leverage installed infrastructure base
 - Establish OS communities on campus to sustain training
 - Leadership programmes
 - Garner support from employers/supervisors for incentives and policies on data and open science skills.
